• Meeting Call to Order:



• Executive Director/Chief of Staff Update

- No Executive Director/Chief of Staff Update at this time.
- Small Business Environmental Assistance Program (SBO/SBEAP/Ombudsman) Update by Mrs. Melissa Collier
 - Gary Rickard, Executive Director, and Chris Wells are aware that there are three (3) remaining vacancies for the Compliance Advisory Panel (CAP) Members. Two (2) Speaker of the House and One (1) Lt. Tate Reeves.
 - 1. Ms. Jennifer Fairly resigned from the CAP in September 2016
 - In October 2014, the SBEAP was placed under the MDEQ Office of Community Engagement.
 - Since the merger, most assistance requests received by the SBEAP were not air related. Most were seeking to address issues with water, wastewater, and solid waste.
 - In late 2014, the SBEAP began helping small municipalities throughout the state. Some of the municipalities who received assistance include:
 - 1. Village of Eden
 - 2. Itta Bena, Mississippi experience difficulties such as using car batteries to keep residents, streets, etc. light on.
 - o Staying relevant to small businesses and other small entities
 - SBEAP has improved its relationship with the Environmental Compliance and Enforcement Division.
 - Region IV will host its regional SBEAP meeting November 29-30, 2016 in Atlanta, GA. Region IV programs will meet to discuss strategies for improving the Region IV programs, differences in state programs, and challenges and changes to state and national programs.
