





ADDENDUM

The following is a summary of changes from the previous Storm Water Mining General Permit to the current Mining Storm Water, Dewatering, and No Discharge General Permit. These changes reflect EPA requirements, clarify existing regulations, and contain measures to reduce administrative burden. One example of burden reduction is that recirculation gravel washing operations or a discharge of impounded water can now be covered under the same general permit as the storm water discharge-a single permit coverage may now be issued instead of several.

This is a summary and does not negate the need for the coverage recipient to carefully read and be familiar with the permit and its conditions.

- The proposed permit format has changed to be consistent with other NPDES permits generated through MDEQ's permitting software system (enSite).
- A Wastewater Recirculation System with No Discharge to Surface Waters component has been added (Activity 11). This operation has previously been regulated by an individual State No Discharge permit.
- A Mining Dewatering component has been added with required pH monitoring (Activity 12). This operation has previously been regulated by an individual NPDES permit.
- The MNOI package can also serve as notification that the mining operation is exempt from a State Office of Geology Surface Mining Permits; and the Office of Geology requirements for Lands Unsuitable for Mining have been incorporated (Activity 10).
- The submittal of the last semi-annual comprehensive report shall be deemed a request for re-coverage under the subsequently reissued general permit (Activity 3).
- Buffer zone requirements contained in the MDEQ water regulations between mining operations and waters of the State have been included for reference (Activity 9).
- New requirements of the Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP): 1) site plan showing that existing buffer zone requirements are met; 2) sediment basin requirement for non-pit mining; 3) housekeeping practices requirement; and 4) hay bales will not, as a stand alone practice, be accepted due to their high maintenance requirements (Activity 5).
- Total Maximum Daily Load (TMDL) and new endangered species language has been added in the eligibility section as well as the requirement that "discharges must not cause nor contribute to violations of State Water Quality Standards" (Activity 2).
- SWPPP must be in compliance with local storm water ordinances (Activity 6).
- Allowable non-storm water discharges have been added (Activity 2).
- Must identify mine boundaries (Activity 6).

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



A. General Provisions

- 1. The definitions and provisions contained in the Mississippi Surface Mining and Reclamation Act ("the Act") and the Mississippi Surface Mining and Reclamation Rules and Regulations ("the Regulations") shall be applied in interpreting any provision of this permit.
- 2. The permittee shall conduct all surface mining and reclamation operations as described in the complete application and any additional operational or reclamation plans submitted to and approved by the Mississippi Department of Environmental Quality ("MDEQ"), while complying with the Act and the Regulations, unless otherwise provided as a variance in the following provisions. The complete application and any additional operational or reclamation plans submitted to and approved by MDEQ currently or in the future are incorporated herein by reference. The provisions and conditions of this permit enforce the provisions of the Act and the Regulations, and no provision of this permit is intended to exempt the permittee from, or to modify, any provision of the Act, the Regulations, or any other Mississippi or federal law or regulation unless the provision is listed in section E of this permit regarding Variances.
- 3. The permittee shall allow any authorized representatives of MDEQ, without advance notice or a search warrant, and without delay, to have the rights of entry provided in the Regulations.
- 4. The permittee shall conduct surface mining and reclamation operations:
 - A. Only on those lands specifically designated on the maps submitted and approved in the complete application;
 - B. Only within the effective dates of the permit; and
 - C. Only on those lands which are subject to the performance bonds or other equivalent guarantee in effect at the time of mining pursuant to the Regulations.

- 4. Duty to mitigate. The permittee shall take all reasonable steps to minimize or correct any adverse impact on the environment resulting from noncompliance with this permit.
- 5. Proper Operation and Maintenance. The permittee shall at all times properly operate and maintain all equipment and systems which are installed or used by the permittee to achieve compliance with the conditions of this permit and the application as submitted to MDEQ and approved by the Mississippi Environmental Quality Permit Board.

6. Duty to provide information. The permittee shall furnish to MDEQ, within a reasonable time, any relevant information which MDEQ may request to determine whether cause exists for modifying, revoking and reissuing, or terminating this permit, or to determine compliance with this permit.

C. Site-Specific Operating Conditions

- 1. The permittee is authorized to open pit mine 274 acres for fill material in Sections 4, 5, 8, and 9, Township 7 South, Range 12 West, Harrison County.
- 2. This is the initial permit for this site.
- 3. Buffer Zones. Also see Part E, Variances and Waivers

The Regulations prohibit mining within 100 feet of the outside right-of-way of any public road, except where mine access roads or haul roads join such right-of-way line; within 300 feet of any occupied dwelling, public building, school, church, community or institutional building; within 100 feet of a cemetery; or, when a highwall will be created and the excavation exceeds thirty feet in depth, within twenty-five feet plus one and one half times the depth of the excavation from a permit boundary. If the excavation is less than thirty feet in depth and a highwall will be created, the distance from the permit boundary shall follow the distance chart in the Regulations at \$400(d)(4). The Permit Board may modify these buffer zones, and allow mining within them, upon receipt of written permission from the subject dwelling.

- A. This permit is not within 100 feet of the outside right-of-way of a public road.
- B. This permit is not within 100 feet of a cemetery.
- C. This permit is not within 300 feet of an occupied dwelling.
- 4. Permit boundaries shall be marked and durable posts shall be placed at the corners of the permit area. The posts shall be painted or flagged to be readily visible during the life of the operation.
- 5. This permit may be mined to a maximum depth of 41 feet.
- 6. Dust shall be controlled by water sprayed on the haul roads.
- 7. Settling ponds, diversion berms, drainage ditches, hay bales, silt fence, and any other Best

Management Practices required will be used for sediment control.

- 8. Reclamation Schedule. Concurrent reclamation is required by the Act and the Regulations.
 - A. Begin clearing: June 2009
 - B. Begin mining: August 2009, and upon permit issuance
 - C. Complete mining: October 2025
 - D. Begin reclamation: concurrent with completion of mining of any segment of the permit, or June 2025
 - E. Complete reclamation: October 2026
- 9. Explosives will not be used.
- 10. The permittee must obtain any necessary permits through the MDEQ Office of Pollution Control to discharge impacted stormwater or processed water into a specific Water(s) of the State and must do so in accordance with effluent limitations, monitoring requirements, and other conditions set forth in a State of Mississippi Waste Pollution Control Permit to Discharge Wastewater in Accordance with the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System.
- 11. Reclamation Plan
 - A. The topsoil shall be segregated and stored in stockpiles which will be protected with grass cover adequate to prevent erosion. The use of the topsoil during reclamation will be to respread it over areas requiring vegetative cover.
 - B. The site shall be reclaimed as a housing development with 6 lakes surrounded by 3 to 1 grassed slopes.
 - C. All highwalls shall be eliminated and all areas of the permit shall be graded to a slope no steeper than three horizontal feet to one vertical foot.
 - D. The permit area shall be graded and planted to grass cover to prevent erosion. The grass cover shall be Bermuda, Fescue, and Clover and is to be planted by broadcast seeding at the rate of 20 pounds per acre, 15 pounds per acre, and 20 pounds per acre, respectively, during the Spring and Fall planting seasons.
 - E. Fertilizer (13-13-13 type), for initial planting, shall be applied at the rate of 1,000

pounds per acre and lime shall be applied at the rate of 2 tons per acre, and be applied and incorporated by broadcasting and disking. Fertilizer (13-13-13 type) shall be applied at the rate of 300 pounds per acre, in March, each successive year prior to final bond release.

- F. Vegetation will be maintained until final bond release by mowing twice each year in June and November and by repairing gullies and replanting eroded areas.
- G. Gullies shall be repaired as necessary to prevent erosion and shall follow all applicable National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permit requirements.
- H. Debris shall be disposed of by burning, as permitted by local and state ordinance.
- 12. The performance bond instrument submitted is Bond No. 105257169 from Travelers Casualty and Surety Company of America, dated May 28, 2009, in the amount of \$274,000.00, which is \$1,000.00 per acre.
- 13. The facility shall be constructed, operated, and monitored in such a manner as to ensure Mississippi Groundwater Quality Standards are not exceeded by any activity of this facility.
- 14. The facility shall be constructed, operated, and monitored in such a manner as to prevent a discharge of pollutants into waters of the State, including wetlands, that violates any requirements of the Clean Water Act or the Mississippi Air And Water Pollution Control Act, including, but not limited to, the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) requirements.
- 15. Based on the Wastewater Regulations for National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Permits, Underground Injection Control (UIC) Permits, State Permits, Water Quality Based Effluent Limitations and Water Quality Certification (Regulation WPC-1), Chapter 3, Section IV, part 3, the following buffer zones shall be established between all mining activity and any existing stream, and maintained for the life of the permit:
 - A. 50-foot buffer zone for intermittent streams (generally shown as a broken blue line on the latest version of the U. S. Geological Survey topographic quadrangle map)
 - B. 100-foot buffer zone for perennial streams (generally shown as a solid blue line on the latest version of the U. S. Geological Survey topographic quadrangle map)
 - C. 300-foot buffer zone for navigable waterways (as defined by the U. S. Army Corps of Engineers)

16. No dam may be constructed on the permitted site without first obtaining prior written authorization for the dam in accordance with Dam Safety Regulation LW-4.

D. Wildlife, Threatened and Endangered Species and Unique Biological Communities

- 1. The permittee shall promptly report to the Mississippi Department of Wildlife, Fisheries, and Parks and MDEQ any State of Mississippi or federally-listed endangered or threatened species within the permit area of which the permittee becomes aware.
- 2. The permittee shall promptly report to the Mississippi Department of Wildlife, Fisheries, and Parks and MDEQ any unique biological communities within the permit area of which the permittee becomes aware.

E. Variances and Waivers







In addition, several forms that were part of the previous permit and required for submittals and recordkeeping, are now enclosed in a separate document called the "Mining General Permit Forms Package."

The submitted Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP) appears to meet permit requirements and will be further reviewed during compliance inspections. The wastewater recirculation system may be operated as long as there is no discharge. A system that discharges must be authorized by a different permit.

This permit coverage is issued in accordance with the provisions of the Mississippi Air and Water Pollution Control Law (Sections 49-17-1, et seq., Mississippi code of 1972), and the regulations and standards adopted and promulgated thereunder and under the authority granted to the Mississippi Environmental Quality Permit Board pursuant to Section 402(b) of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act. Any appeal of this action must be made within the 30-day period provided for in Section 49-17-29(4)(b) Mississippi code of 1972.

ADDENDUM

The following is a summary of changes from the previous Storm Water Mining General Permit to the current Mining Storm Water, Dewatering, and No Discharge General Permit. These changes reflect EPA requirements, clarify existing regulations, and contain measures to reduce administrative burden. One example of burden reduction is that recirculation gravel washing operations or a discharge of impounded water can now be covered under the same general permit as the storm water discharge-a single permit coverage may now be issued instead of several.

This is a summary and does not negate the need for the coverage recipient to carefully read and be familiar with the permit and its conditions.

- The proposed permit format has changed to be consistent with other NPDES permits generated through MDEQ's permitting software system (enSite).
- A Wastewater Recirculation System with No Discharge to Surface Waters component has been added (Activity 11). This operation has previously been regulated by an individual State No Discharge permit.
- A Mining Dewatering component has been added with required pH monitoring (Activity 12). This operation has previously been regulated by an individual NPDES permit.
- The MNOI package can also serve as notification that the mining operation is exempt from a State Office of Geology Surface Mining Permits; and the Office of Geology requirements for Lands Unsuitable for Mining have been incorporated (Activity 10).
- The submittal of the last semi-annual comprehensive report shall be deemed a request for re-coverage under the subsequently reissued general permit (Activity 3).
- Buffer zone requirements contained in the MDEQ water regulations between mining operations and waters of the State have been included for reference (Activity 9).
- New requirements of the Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP): 1) site plan showing that existing buffer zone requirements are met; 2) sediment basin requirement for non-pit mining; 3) housekeeping practices requirement; and 4) hay bales will not, as a stand alone practice, be accepted due to their high maintenance requirements (Activity 5).
- Total Maximum Daily Load (TMDL) and new endangered species language has been added in the eligibility section as well as the requirement that "discharges must not cause nor contribute to violations of State Water Quality Standards" (Activity 2).
- SWPPP must be in compliance with local storm water ordinances (Activity 6).
- Allowable non-storm water discharges have been added (Activity 2).
- Must identify mine boundaries (Activity 6).

STORM WATER POLLUTION PROTECTION PLAN FOR MURRAY PIT WOLF RIVER ROAD, GULFPORT, MS

Site Information: In order to reshape the existing contours on the property to make for a more residential friendly home site, the existing hills needed to be gently sloped for a more easily accessible and maintained pastureland.

Controls: A twenty foot (20') undisturbed vegetative buffer zone will be kept around each wetland delineated area and any other runoff areas. Existing hardwood timber will be preserved where possible. Topsoil will be stockpiled and dressed back over the recontoured areas for optimum pasture grass growth. All newly established grades will be stabilized by use of crimping, grassing and/or appropriate seeding methods to permanently establish grass growth in all the disturbed areas. As the area is reclaimed, appropriate for the season. Byhalia grass will be used to provide a pasture grass.

Noxious weeds will not be allowed.

Structural Controls: A berm of topsoil will be placed outside the wetland buffer zone. Silt fences will be installed behind the berms to further protect the undisturbed wetland buffer. Hay bales will also be utilized, as necessary, to eliminate unstable soil erosion. Natural drainage will be directed to a siltation basin. These sediment basins will be constructed at areas where runoff leaves the property. Natural upslope drainage will be diverted around the disturbed areas. The need for a construction entrance is not anticipated. A cattle gap type bar system will be used for the construction entrance tire control along with paving the first 300' of the haul road which intersects Wolf River Road.

Housekeeping Practices: Since this is a considered a homestead, all trash will be collected on the site and placed for the county maintained solid waste collectors to pick up on their scheduled days. No maintenance or repairs to heavy equipment will be allowed on the site. It is not anticipated that toxic materials will be necessary on the site, however chemicals and fertilizers necessary for the pasture growth and fire ant protection may be used on site from time to time.

Post Construction Storm Water Management Measures: Once positive drainage and grassing efforts have taken hold, temporary siltation basins will be converted to a detention basin after re-contouring the lay of the land. It is not anticipated that there will be high runoff velocities, but if this does appear, appropriate riprap will be placed to prevent erosion in these areas.

Implementation Sequence: Stockpile topsoil, install berm, install silt fences, install sediment basins, grass/crimp and stabilize these areas, recontour hills, seed disturbed areas, complete final contours, disc, grass, fertilize, make sure site is stabilized, remove temporary controls, vegetate these areas and convert siltation basins to detention basins.

Maintenance Plan: Monitor and make steps to maintain positive drainage and make sure erosion control methods are working properly. After significant rainfall, monitor erosion and sediment controls to make sure any needed repairs are made to system. Make sure proper ground cover, whether by reseeding or mulching vegetated areas.

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

STORM WATER POLLUTION PROTECTION PLAN FOR MURRAY PIT WOLF RIVER ROAD, GULFPORT, MS

Site Information: The site is to be reshaped to facilitate the development of residential lots around six separate lake structures, including roadway and green space areas. Excavation of the lake structures will provide retention areas for storm water, gradual sloping of the lakes perimeter areas toward the lake structures will maintain all storm water on site with no storm water discharge to any adjacent properties, creeks or streams.

Controls: A two hundred and fifty foot (250') undisturbed vegetative buffer zone will be kept around the perimeter of the permitted property. Each lake will be developed separately in sequence of Alpha, Bravo, Charlie, Delta, Echo and Fox Trot. As construction begins, the lake area will be cleared, a silt fence perimeter will be established around the entire perimeter of the lake structure. Topsoil will be stockpiled and dressed back over the lake perimeter areas. All newly established grades will be stabilized by use of crimping, grassing and/or appropriate seeding methods to permanently establish grass growth in all the disturbed areas. As the area is reclaimed, the entire area will be grassed and fertilized with a summer and/or winter grass mix as appropriate for the season.

Structural Controls: Natural upslope drainage will be diverted around the disturbed areas. The need for a construction entrance on the south side of the site is anticipated. A cattle gap type bar system will be used for the construction entrance tire control along with paving the first 300' of the haul road which intersects Wolf River Road.

Housekeeping Practices: Since this is a considered a homestead, all trash will be collected on the site and placed for the county maintained solid waste collectors to pick up on their scheduled days. No maintenance or repairs to heavy equipment will be allowed on the site. It is not anticipated that toxic materials will be necessary on the site.

Post Construction Storm Water Management Measures: Once positive drainage and permanent grassing has been established, silt fencing will be removed and these areas will be dressed and receive permanent grassing. It is not anticipated that there will be high runoff velocities, but if this does occur, washes will be repaired in a timely manner, and additional measures will be implemented to correct these areas

Implementation Sequence: Clear and grubb each lake area in sequence, place a silt fence perimeter around lake area, stockpile topsoil, grade lake perimeter, grass/crimp and stabilize these areas, excavate lake to proper elevations, grade all disturbed area, seed disturbed areas, complete final contours, disc, grass, fertilize, make sure site is stabilized, remove temporary controls, vegetate these areas and convert siltation basins.

Maintenance Plan: Monitor and make steps to maintain positive drainage and make sure erosion control methods are working properly. After significant rainfall, monitor erosion and sediment controls to make sure any needed repairs are made to system. Make sure proper ground cover, whether by reseeding or mulching vegetated areas.

STORM WATER POLLUTION PROTECTION PLAN FOR MURRAY PIT WOLF RIVER ROAD, GULFPORT, MS

Site Information: In order to reshape the existing contours on the property to make for a more residential friendly home site, the existing hills needed to be gently sloped for a more easily accessible and maintained pastureland.

Controls: A twenty foot (20') undisturbed vegetative buffer zone will be kept around each wetland delineated area and any other runoff areas. Existing hardwood timber will be preserved where possible. Topsoil will be stockpiled and dressed back over the recontoured areas for optimum pasture grass growth. All newly established grades will be stabilized by use of crimping, grassing and/or appropriate seeding methods to permanently establish grass growth in all the disturbed areas. As the area is reclaimed, the entire area will be grassed and fertilized with a summer and/or winter grass mix as appropriate for the season. Byhalia grass will be used to provide a pasture grass environment for livestock.

Noxious weeds will not be allowed.

Structural Controls: A berm of topsoil will be placed outside the wetland buffer zone. Silt fences will be installed behind the berms to further protect the undisturbed wetland buffer. Hay bales will also be utilized, as necessary, to eliminate unstable soil erosion. Natural drainage will be directed to a siltation basin. These sediment basins will be constructed at areas where runoff leaves the property. Natural upslope drainage will be diverted around the disturbed areas. The need for a construction entrance is not anticipated. A cattle gap type bar system will be used for the construction entrance tire control along with paving the first 300' of the haul road which intersects Wolf River Road.

Housekeeping Practices: Since this is a considered a homestead, all trash will be collected on the site and placed for the county maintained solid waste collectors to pick up on their scheduled days. No maintenance or repairs to heavy equipment will be allowed on the site. It is not anticipated that toxic materials will be necessary on the site, however chemicals and fertilizers necessary for the pasture growth and fire ant protection may be used on site from time to time.

Post Construction Storm Water Management Measures: Once positive drainage and grassing efforts have taken hold, temporary siltation basins will be converted to a detention basin after re-contouring the lay of the land. It is not anticipated that there will be high runoff velocities, but if this does appear, appropriate riprap will be placed to prevent erosion in these areas.

Implementation Sequence: Stockpile topsoil, install berm, install silt fences, install sediment basins, grass/crimp and stabilize these areas, recontour hills, seed disturbed areas, complete final contours, disc, grass, fertilize, make sure site is stabilized, remove temporary controls, vegetate these areas and convert siltation basins to detention basins.

Maintenance Plan: Monitor and make steps to maintain positive drainage and make sure erosion control methods are working properly. After significant rainfall, monitor erosion and sediment controls to make sure any needed repairs are made to system. Make sure proper ground cover, whether by reseeding or mulching vegetated areas.

Section B, question 10 should be changed to "No" since there is to be no discharge.

- The "Mining Notice of Intent" form also needs the block for Wastewater Recirculation System with No Discharge checked.
- On Page 3 of same form, delete wording on the receiving stream line.
- Need copies to the application to the ACOE for wetlands and their report.
- Need copy of Letter of Approval from the Harrison County Utility Authority.

Upon receipt of this information, the Environmental Permits Division will continue the permitting process for your project. Please be advised the discharge of storm water without written notification of coverage or issuance of an individual National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Storm Water Permit is a violation of state law.
