I live on Thomas Lane.


I have talked to some of the truck drivers up at the landfill. They say there is no way they are going to get 6 years out of that landfill.

Everybody out here who has lived out here as long as I have wants Mr. Bilberry to get that landfill. One of them can't say it.

What I'm trying to tell you is people who been through some times and know things in life don't mind it. People came out here because of Mr. Bilberry giving the property for the road.

It is progress for Mr Bilberry to get his landfill and not forget people like BFI did.

The number of landfills don't mean near as much as a big one that is not as good. If the laws were put in place because old landfills weren't done right, why would you keep using the old one if you could use a new one that is better.

DEQ needs to let Mr. Bilberry come on. The distance from the road was approved by everybody who talked to the company. The others didn't care about anything. You could put it 600 feet away and offer to do it anyway they wanted it and it wouldn't matter. But one of them wants it and just can't say. But that's okay. Family comes first.

I live on Thomas Lane across from NCL

DEQ said it wanted us involved. When since we got involved and decided we didn't mind Mr. Bilberry's landfill DEQ has been lying.

We should never have told DEQ we supported Mr. Bilberry because when we did DEQ went out and got people who don't have anything to do with the landfills to oppose Mr. Bilberry. Those people who talked at the Church opposed BFI but DEQ says they are going to get a permit. When they learn DEQ is going to let BFI take the cover that holds odors down, they are going to be sorry.

I will send you a paper we got us showing BFI was going to be built higher when the man in the Church said it wasn't. That's a lie. The Bible says Satan is the father of lies.

Bishop Williams and his people are not going to like DEQ lying to Black People in his Church. I been praying for Mr. Bilberry's landfill because it will help people out here who need it and the jobs. People who make fun of us ought to be ashamed.

I am going to pray for you. I don't know you, but if you are having to deal with this mess you need prayers. Just do what's right. You know 200 feet is enough off the road and you know it has a lot of trees.
