

Ladies and Gentlemen:

Lam a current resident and homeowner in the Thomas Lane area off North County Line Road in Hinds County. I reside at 20057 North County Line Rd., Jackson, Mississippi 39213.

Please accept this letter as my notice to you that, after reviewing and considering relevant facts and updated information, I withdraw my previous opposition to the NCL Landfill, and further, I am no longer opposed to any aspect of NCL Landfill planned for this area.

- A) The location of the NCL Landfill's active area, as it will not be directly across from Thomas Lane, or our homes, as we were previously led to believe:
- B) The location of the subject property in general, as it is now landlocked by the BFI landfill to the south and the Ballard landfill to the north (which landfill was permitted to began operations a few years ago);
- C) The opportunity to participate in a better community involvement model for landfill development which can be used as a guide or template for other areas and the development of other landfills;



- D) The acknowledgment that a failure to develop the NCL Landfill, with the agreed-upon setbacks, screens, borders and other limitations agreed to by NCL Waste, could invite other less desirable use of the land, such as mining, resulting in removal of all forests and timber up to the road, and a much greater increase in heavy-truck traffic and road destruction;
