MDEQ ISSUES BEACH CLOSURE FOR ONE STATION IN HANCOCK COUNTY

(JACKSON, Miss.) -- The Mississippi Department of Environmental Quality (MDEQ), through its Beach Monitoring Program, issued a beach closure Friday for Sampling Station 1 in Hancock County due to beach re-nourishment activities in the area.

•Station 1 -- Lakeshore Beach -- from the Sliver Slipper Casino eastward to the jetty west of Poinset Avenue.

The beach closure is being issued due to the possibility of high bacteria levels and dangerous physical conditions caused by beach re-nourishment activities underway in this area. The re-nourishment work utilizes dredges which can release bacteria trapped in the floor of the Mississippi Sound. It can also present dangerous physical conditions including unpredictable terrain, surf, and quicksand plus the presence of heavy equipment operating in the area.

•Station 4 – Bay St. Louis Beach – is also still closed for a beach re-nourishment project.

MDEQ will lift the closures after the re-nourishment activities have been completed and water samples show that levels are safe for human contact. The Gulf Coast Research Laboratory, which performs water sampling of the Mississippi Gulf Coast beaches for MDEQ, notifies the agency when an area has returned to acceptable levels.
