

FUNDING STREAM INFORMATION

NATURAL RESOURCE DAMAGE ASSESSMENT (NRDA)

BP must pay \$8.1 billion in natural resource damages, including \$1 billion previously committed to pay for early restoration projects. The designated federal and state trustee agencies will use these funds to restore Gulf of Mexico natural resources injured in the *Deepwater Horizon* oil spill. The federal and state trustees have agreed to an allocation of the \$8.1 billion among 5 restoration goals and 13 restoration categories designed to meet these goals. Mississippi received \$112.557 million in NRDA Early Restoration payments. Mississippi will receive an additional \$183 million in NRDA funds paid over 15 years through 2031.
