A Master's Degree in an engineering curriculum from a school or college wherein that same engineering curriculum at the undergraduate level is approved by the Mississippi State Board of Registration for Professional Engineers and Land Surveyors as of satisfactory standing, preferably with courses in environmental engineering; **AND**

A Bachelor's Degree in engineering, engineering technology, or related science curriculum of four (4) scholastic years from a school or college other than those approved by the Mississippi State Board of Registration for Professional Engineers and Land Surveyors, preferably with courses in environmental engineering.

Special Requirement:

Incumbent must possess a valid Driver's License from Mississippi or a contiguous state.

Primary Functions:

- Serve as regional planning engineer for coordinating the development, review, approval, and implementation of comprehensive solid waste management plans for assigned counties located predominantly in the North Region of the State.
- Complete tasks associated with the waste tire management program for assigned counties including permitting and compliance/enforcement activities for waste tire management facilities; coordination with regional office staff to resolve waste tire complaints; and periodic evaluation of local government waste tire management programs.
- Conduct review and approval of requests for beneficial use determinations on industrial by-products as well as review and oversee demonstration project efforts to help evaluate formal beneficial use determinations.
- Assist in evaluation/oversight of corrective action trust fund projects at historic landfills in the engineer's assigned counties in the state.
- Conduct regulatory, policy, and program development efforts for various special wastes including medical waste, construction and demolition debris wastes, electronic wastes, industrial wastes, and other special wastes of concern.
- Provide basic information services and staff assistance to the public and the regulated community regarding solid waste programs for the State of Mississippi.
