NARRATIVE DESCRIPTION:

A map showing the location of each activity is attached as Exhibit A. This sixth amendment to Mississippi's Multiyear Implementation Plan (MIP) adds four new projects (Activities 40, 41, 42, and 43) and modifies eleven projects previously accepted on the Initial MIP and subsequent amendments (Activities 3, 4, 7, 8, 11, 14, 15, 20, 30, 36, and 39), which are only modified to the extent described below. Projects may start earlier or later than the proposed start dates depending on the availability of funds and readiness of the project.

Activity #3: Improved Fiber Optic Infrastructure (Modified)

This project was accepted under Mississippi's Initial MIP and was modified under MIP Amendment #4. Project activities are complete, and the grant award has been closed.

Project Modification: Amendment #6 modifies this project budget to reflect the total funds expended of \$45,653.72. The grant is closed.

Activity #4: Mississippi Aquarium (Modified)

This project was accepted under Mississippi's Initial MIP and was modified under MIP Amendment #3. Project activities are complete, and the grant award has been closed.

Project Modification: Amendment #6 modifies this project budget to reflect the total funds expended of \$17,748,244.04. The grant is closed.

Activity #7: Accreditation Support for William Carey University School of Pharmacy (Modified)

This project was accepted under Mississippi's Initial MIP. Project activities are complete, and the grant award has been closed.

Project Modification: Amendment #6 modifies this project budget to reflect the total funds expended of \$985,903.99. The grant is closed.

Activity #8: Off-Bottom Oyster Aquaculture Program (Modified)

This project was accepted under Mississippi's Initial MIP. Project activities are complete, and the grant award has been closed.

Project Modification: Amendment #6 modifies this project budget to reflect the total funds expended of \$1,061,371.31. The grant is closed.

Activity #11: Planning Assistance – MIP Amendment and Application Development (Modified)

This project was accepted under Mississippi's Initial MIP to provide planning assistance to support the Mississippi Department of Environmental Quality (MDEQ) in the development of multiple MIP amendments. MDEQ has received a planning assistance award from the U.S. Department of the Treasury (Treasury) for this project. The proposed project modification includes an increase in funding this project to support MDEQ in the development of future MIP amendments and applications. There is no modification to the Program Description, Need, Purpose, Objective, Location or Milestones as outlined and accepted in MIP Amendment #5.

Project Modification: This project budget is being modified to increase the Direct Component funding by \$500,000. This increase in funding is needed to support MDEQ's development of future MIP amendments and other activities under this project's scope of work.

Activity #14: North Rail Connector – Planning Assistance (Modified)

This project was accepted under Mississippi's MIP Amendment #1. Project activities are complete, and the grant award has been closed.

Project Modification: Amendment #6 modifies this project budget to reflect the total funds expended of \$546,148.28. The grant is closed.

Activity #15: National Oceans and Applications Research Center (NOARC) - Planning Assistance (Modified)

This project was accepted under Mississippi's MIP Amendment #1. Project activities are complete, and the grant award has been closed.

Project Modification: Amendment #6 modifies this project budget to reflect the total funds expended of \$2,629,110.07. The grant is closed.

Activity #20: Pearl River Community College Workforce Center (Modified)

This project was accepted under Mississippi's MIP Amendment #2 and was subsequently modified under MIP Amendment #3. MDEQ has received a grant award from Treasury for this project, and MDEQ has executed a sub-award agreement with Pearl River Community College for implementation. There is no modification to the Project Description, Need, Purpose, Objective, Location or Milestones as outlined and accepted in Mississippi's MIP Amendment #2.

Project Modification: The project budget is being modified to increase the Direct Component funding by \$2,090,000 to support the implementation of improvements consistent with the Project Description, Need, Purpose and Objective as accepted in MIP Amendment #2.

Activity #30: City of Moss Point Interstate 10 Commercial Corridor Improvements (Modified)

This project was accepted under Mississippi's MIP Amendment #4 and subsequently modified under MIP Amendment #5. MDEQ has received a grant award from Treasury for this project, and MDEQ has executed a sub-award agreement with the City of Moss Point for implementation. There is no modification to the Project Description, Need, Purpose, Objective, Location or Milestones as outlined and accepted in MIP Amendment #5.

Project Modification: The project budget is being modified to increase the Direct Component funding by \$5,500,000 to support implementation of additional infrastructure improvements consistent with the Project Description, Need, Purpose and Objective as accepted in MIP Amendment #5. Improvements may include, but are not limited to, roadway construction between Elder Ferry Road and Trehern Street and associated installation of infrastructure such as storm drainage, sanitary sewer, and water lines.

Activity #36: Gulfport-Biloxi Airport Site Mitigation and Improvements (Modified)

This project was accepted under Mississippi's MIP Amendment #5. MDEQ has received a grant award from Treasury for this project and MDEQ has executed a sub-award agreement with the Gulfport-Biloxi Regional Airport Authority. The project as accepted on MIP Amendment #5 is to support site preparation activities for the Project Ready site at the airport, demolition of the existing fleet facility, and the design and construction of a new vehicle fleet maintenance facility. The proposed project modification includes the addition of activities and an increase of funding to the existing award. There is no modification to the Milestones or Location as outlined and accepted in MIP Amendment #5.

Project Modification: This project description is being modified to include planning activities to support infrastructure improvements to the secondary runway at the Gulfport-Biloxi International Airport (GBIA). Additional activities may include, but are not limited to, engineering and design, environmental assessments, and permitting. The project budget is being modified to increase the Direct Component funding by \$2,200,000. This increase in funding is needed to complete the activities described.

Need: Site improvements are needed to encourage future aeronautical development and to better service commercial and military airlines at GBIA.

Purpose: The purpose of this project is to support planning activities, site preparation, and construction at GBIA to facilitate aeronautical development opportunities and better accommodate commercial air traffic.

Objective: To complete planning activities and construction for GBIA improvements.

Activity #39: Washington Avenue Gateway (Modified)

This project was accepted under Mississippi's MIP Amendment #5. There is no modification to the Project Description, Need, Purpose, Objective, Location or Milestones as outlined and accepted in Mississippi's MIP Amendment #5.

Project Modification: The project budget is being modified to increase the Direct Component funding by \$5,500,000 to support implementation of additional infrastructure improvements consistent with the Project Description, Need, Purpose and Objective as accepted in MIP Amendment #5.

Activity #40: Lowry Island Restoration

Project Summary:

This proposed project will support infrastructure benefitting the economy in the Gulf Coast Region through site improvements and construction of a public marina for enhanced public use as well as encouraging economic development.

The Lowry Island Restoration Project is located at the gateway to the City of Pascagoula along U.S. Highway 90. Currently, a small area of the site is used by the public for fishing and other recreational activities. Completion of this project would prepare Lowry Island for future tourism and economic development opportunities. Project components may include, but are not limited to, site cleanup, debris removal, shoreline stabilization, and the permitting, design and construction of a public marina located on the west side of the island which could include boat slips, floating piers, and boardwalks. Additionally, roadways, parking, sidewalks, and enhancements to the existing public waterfront are also planned.

Activities necessary to complete this proposed project may include, but are not limited to, engineering and design, permitting, construction site preparation, and construction. Other activities may be added/finalized with the grant application, after completion of engineering and design, or prior to requesting Notice to Proceed with construction from Treasury. Direct Component funds may also be used for project oversight and management activities; the development, coordination, and execution of the grant award between MDEQ and Treasury; and the development, coordination, and execution of the sub-award between MDEQ and the sub-recipient.

This proposed project aligns with the Infrastructure and Economic Development priorities developed by the Governor's Gulf Coast Advisory Committee.

Need: Lowry Island in Pascagoula is underutilized in its current state and needs restoration and site improvements to attract tourism, economic development, and increased revenue sources.

Purpose: The purpose of this project is to prepare Lowry Island for future tourism and economic development opportunities and enhance access to the public with the completion of new infrastructure and site improvements.

Objective: Construction of a public marina with amenities and site improvements for enhanced public use and economic development opportunities.

Activity #41: The Kiln Utility and Fire District Water Infrastructure Expansion Project

Project Summary:

This proposed project will support infrastructure benefitting the economy of the Gulf Coast Region by providing needed infrastructure upgrades to support current and future development in the project area.

The Kiln Utility and Fire District services a growing area of Hancock County. Current infrastructure limitations do not provide adequate water supply and fire protection along Kiln-Delisle Road and Kapalama Drive north of the City of Diamondhead. The improvements will provide the necessary infrastructure to support the growing area. Anticipated activities include the installation of fire hydrants and 12" PVC waterline to replace existing 8" and 6" waterlines which do not provide the adequate capacity and fire protection for current and future development in the area. This project will support the opportunity for economic development along Kiln-Delisle Road, as well as the potential for connection of existing businesses along Kapalama Drive, an area currently not provided water service.

Activities necessary to complete this proposed project may include, but are not limited to, engineering and design, permitting, construction site preparation, and construction. Other activities may be added/finalized with the grant application, after completion of engineering and design, or prior to requesting Notice to Proceed with construction from Treasury. Direct Component funds may also be used for project oversight and management activities; the development, coordination, and execution of the grant award between MDEQ and Treasury; and the development, coordination, and execution of the sub-award between MDEQ and the sub-recipient.

This proposed project aligns with the Infrastructure and Economic Development priorities developed by the Governor's Gulf Coast Advisory Committee.

Need: Current infrastructure limitations to do not provide the adequate water supply and fire protection along Kiln-Delisle Road and Kapalama Drive north of the City of Diamondhead needed to support economic growth in the area.

Purpose: The purpose of this proposed project is to meet current and future water demands near Kiln-Delisle Road and Kapalama Drive.

Objective: Improve infrastructure to support future community development and growth.

Activity #42: Trent Lott International Airport North Apron Expansion

Project Summary: This proposed project will support infrastructure benefitting the economy in the Gulf Coast Region through the construction of a new aircraft parking apron and connector taxiway at the Trent Lott International Airport (TLIA) in Jackson County, Mississippi.

TLIA, the centerpiece of the Jackson County Aviation Technology Park, is a vital asset that supports the region's efforts to grow the aerospace sector. TLIA is well-suited for aviation supply operations to service the region's growing aerospace industry. Recent TLIA improvements, including the widening and strengthening of the runway, have significantly increased the need for the requested apron expansion. The expanded apron and additional taxiway are a vital next step in the infrastructure at the airport that is needed to benefit the local economy.

The proposed project will support the construction of apron space, taxiways, and would provide frontage for the development of new aircraft hangars. Activities necessary to complete this proposed project may include, but are not limited to, construction site preparation and construction. Other activities may be added/finalized with the grant application, after completion of engineering and design, or prior to requesting Notice to Proceed with construction from Treasury. Direct Component funds may also be used for project oversight and management activities; the development, coordination, and execution of the grant award between MDEQ and Treasury; and the development, coordination, and execution of the sub-award between MDEQ and the sub-recipient.

This proposed project aligns with the Infrastructure and Economic Development priorities developed by the Governor's Gulf Coast Advisory Committee.

Need: Improving the capacity of Trent Lott International Airport's apron and taxiway is needed to support existing industry and enhance competitiveness for the attraction of new opportunities.

Purpose: The purpose of this project is to implement infrastructure improvements to support the airport's ability to attract new industry, support existing industry, and increase aviation activities.

Objective: Implement apron and taxiway improvements at Trent Lott International Airport.

Activity #43: Port Bienville Railroad Intermodal Expansion

Project Summary:

This proposed project will support infrastructure benefitting the economy of the Gulf Coast Region through the construction of a classification yard and an intermodal switch lead at the Port Bienville Railroad (PBVR).

Port Bienville Railroad, operated by the Hancock County Port and Harbor Commission, processes about 8,000 loaded rail cars a year for port tenants that employ 600 people. The railroad connects Port Bienville Industrial Park to CSX Class I service. The lack of storage at the PBVR often results in manufacturers and logistics companies located at the Port Bienville Industrial Park to rely on freight trucks to transport their cargo. The project will construct a seven-track classification yard and an intermodal switch lead, which provides rail access to the classification yard tying into the existing mainline with multiple turnouts. The improvements will add storage for an estimated 235 rail cars and allow for multi-directional blocking, opening the option to load cars on both east-bound and west-bound tracks. The project will make the Gulf Coast rail corridor more efficient for freight and will alleviate congestion, reduce unscheduled overtime, and increase safety and efficiency at PBVR. The additional storage capacity and blocking functionality of the project would allow the PBVR to send and receive more railcars.

Activities necessary to complete this proposed project may include, but are not limited to, engineering and design, permitting, and construction of the intermodal rail expansion site. Other activities may be added/finalized with the grant application, after completion of engineering and design, or prior to requesting Notice to Proceed with construction from Treasury. Direct Component funds may also be used for project oversight and management activities; the development, coordination, and execution of the grant award between MDEQ and Treasury; and the development, coordination, and execution of the sub-award between MDEQ and the sub-recipient.

This proposed project aligns with the Infrastructure and Economic Development priorities developed by the Governor's Gulf Coast Advisory Committee.

Need: Due to the capacity restraints of the existing rail infrastructure, PBVR cannot accommodate increased demand for storage or new industrial recruitment. There is a need for increased storage of rail cars at PBVR.

Purpose: The purpose of this proposed project is to make the Gulf Coast rail corridor more efficient for freight service along the Gulf Coast.

Objective: To increase the storage and intermodal facilities at PBVR.

On January 13, 2023, the Mississippi Department of Environmental Quality (MDEQ) published its amended MIP for public review and comment. The MDEQ announced the amended MIP at the 2022 Restoration Summit in Biloxi, MS. During the 2022 Restoration Summit, MDEQ representatives presented project information to the public. Vietnamese and Spanish translation services were available. A notice was published in the Sun Herald and Clarion-Ledger newspapers informing the public that the amended MIP was available for public review and comment. An email blast was also sent to those registered to receive notices. This amended MIP was made available for public review and comment for a total of 62 days, from January 13, 2023, until March 15, 2023. The amended MIP and a corresponding map were available to the public, directly downloadable, through www.restore.ms, and were also available upon request via email, fax, telephone, or mail directly from MDEQ. The amended MIP was available in English, Spanish, and Vietnamese upon request.

MDEQ accepted public comments and input electronically via www.restore.ms, as well as via email, fax, telephone, or mail directly to MDEQ. On February 16, 2023, MDEQ delivered an email blast to remind those registered to receive notices that the public review and comment period for the amended MIP would close on March 15, 2023. A final email blast was delivered on March 13, 2023, as a reminder that the public review and comment period for the amended MIP would close on March 15, 2023.

During the public review and comment period, MDEQ received a total of one (1) set of written comments. No other comments were submitted. The comments have been summarized for purposes of this response. All comments submitted during the public review and comment period were reviewed and considered by MDEQ. Each activity in the amended MIP was adopted after consideration of meaningful input from the public.

This activity will be implemented by the Mississippi Department of Environmental Quality and will comply with the definition of planning assistance in 31 C.F.R. §34.2.

Activity #20: Pearl River Community College Workforce Center (Modified)

This project is located in the Gulf Coast Region as defined by 31 C.F.R. §34.2. This project will support infrastructure benefitting the economy of the Gulf Coast Region by supporting the Pearl River Community College's (PRCC) construction of a Workforce Center to enhance workforce training capacity; this project qualifies as an eligible activity for Direct Component funding under 31 C.F.R. §34.201(f) - infrastructure benefitting the economy or ecological resources, and 33 U.S.C. §1321 (t)(1)(B)(i)(VI) of the RESTORE Act. This activity will be implemented by Pearl River Community College and will comply with the definition of infrastructure in 31 C.F.R. §34.2.

Activity #30: City of Moss Point Interstate 10 Commercial Corridor Improvements (Modified)

This project is located in the Gulf Coast Region as defined by 31 C.F.R. §34.2. This project will support infrastructure benefitting the economy of the Gulf Coast Region by enhancing access to existing businesses and the ability to support additional commercial development in Moss Point's I-10 commercial district; this project qualifies as an eligible activity for Direct Component funding under 31 C.F.R. §34.201(f) - infrastructure benefitting the economy or ecological resources, and 33 U.S.C. §1321 (t)(1)(B)(i)(VI) of the RESTORE Act. This activity will be implemented by the City of Moss Point and will comply with the definition of infrastructure in 31 C.F.R.§34.2.

Activity #36: Gulfport-Biloxi Airport Site Mitigation and Improvements (Modified)

This proposed project is located in the Gulf Coast Region as defined by 31 C.F.R. §34.2. This proposed project will support infrastructure benefitting the economy of the Gulf Coast Region by supporting site improvement at the Gulfport-Biloxi International Airport; this proposed project qualifies as an eligible activity for Direct Component funding under 31 C.F.R. §34.201(f) - infrastructure benefitting the economy or ecological resources, and 33 U.S.C. §1321 (t)(1)(B)(i)(VI) of the RESTORE Act. This activity will be implemented by the Gulfport-Biloxi Regional Airport Authority and will comply with the definition of infrastructure in 31 C.F.R.§34.2.

Activity #39: Washington Avenue Gateway (Modified)

This proposed project is located in the Gulf Coast Region as defined by 31 C.F.R. §34.2. This proposed project will support infrastructure benefitting the economy of the Gulf Coast Region by enhancing access to existing businesses and the ability to support additional development along Washington Avenue; this proposed project qualifies as an eligible activity for Direct Component funding under 31 C.F.R. §34.201(f) - infrastructure benefitting the economy or ecological resources, and 33 U.S.C. §1321 (t)(1)(B)(i)(VI) of the RESTORE Act. This activity will be implemented by the Jackson County Board of Supervisors and will comply with the definition of infrastructure in 31 C.F.R.§34.2.

Activity #40: Lowry Island Restoration

This proposed project is located in the Gulf Coast Region as defined by 31 C.F.R. §34.2. This proposed project will support infrastructure benefitting the economy of the Gulf Coast Region by enhancing public access at Lowry Island with new infrastructure and improvements; this project qualifies as an eligible activity for Direct Component funding under 31 C.F.R. §34.201(f)-

infrastructure benefitting the economy or ecological resources, and 33 U.S.C. §1321 (t)(1)(B)(i)(VI) of the RESTORE Act. This activity will be implemented by the City of Pascagoula and will comply with the definition of infrastructure in 31 C.F.R.§34.2.

Activity #41: The Kiln Utility and Fire District Water Infrastructure Expansion Project

This proposed project is located in the Gulf Coast Region as defined by 31 C.F.R. §34.2. This proposed project will support infrastructure benefitting the economy of the Gulf Coast Region by expanding and upgrading waterline infrastructure in Hancock County; this project qualifies as an eligible activity for Direct Component funding under 31 C.F.R. §34.201(f)- infrastructure benefitting the economy or ecological resources, and 33 U.S.C. §1321 (t)(1)(B)(i)(VI) of the RESTORE Act. This activity will be implemented by Kiln Utility and Fire District and will comply with the definition of infrastructure in 31 C.F.R.§34.2.

Activity #42 Trent Lott International Airport North Apron Expansion

This proposed project is located in the Gulf Coast Region as defined by 31 C.F.R. §34.2. This proposed project will support infrastructure benefitting the economy of the Gulf Coast Region by enhancing the region's ability to support improved aviation by enhancement of the Trent Lott International Airport; this project qualifies as an eligible activity for Direct Component funding under 31 C.F.R. §34.201(f)- infrastructure benefitting the economy or ecological resources, and 33 U.S.C. §1321 (t)(1)(B)(i)(VI) of the RESTORE Act. This activity will be implemented by Jackson County Airport Authority and will comply with the definition of infrastructure in 31 C.F.R.§34.2.

Activity #43: Port Bienville Railroad Intermodal Expansion

This proposed project is located in the Gulf Coast Region as defined by 31 C.F.R. §34.2. This proposed project will support infrastructure benefitting the economy of the Gulf Coast Region by increasing railcar storage and intermodal facilities for the Port Bienville Railroad; this proposed project qualifies as an eligible activity for Direct Component funding under 31 C.F.R. §34.201(f)-infrastructure benefitting the economy or ecological resources, and 33 U.S.C. §1321 (t)(1)(B)(i)(VI) of the RESTORE Act. This activity will be implemented by Hancock County Port and Harbor Commission and will comply with the definition of infrastructure in 31 C.F.R.§34.2.

5. How the activities included in the multiyear plan narrative were prioritized and list the criteria used to establish the priorities.

The projects were prioritized using the following two (2) criteria:

- 1. All projects included in MIP Amendment #6 are eligible for RESTORE Act funding under the Direct Component eligible activities for: infrastructure projects benefitting the economy and recreation; and planning assistance
- 2. Mississippi utilized three stakeholder-driven components to identify and prioritize all projects for inclusion in MIP Amendment #6: Coastal Resource Engagement Meetings; The Governor's Gulf Coast Advisory Committee (GCAC); and the Restoration Project Idea Portal. Items (a) through (e) below provide further explanation for the GCAC process:
- (a) Governor Tate Reeves created the GCAC to serve as an advisory body to the Governor for recommendation of projects to be funded for Mississippi under the RESTORE Act.
- (b) The GCAC is comprised of over 70 engaged stakeholders, including private citizens, non-governmental organizations, business owners, elected officials, and other community leaders from the Mississippi Coast
- (c) The GCAC formed seven sub-committees that focused on seven key areas related to the activities specified in the RESTORE Act (Eco-restoration, Economic Development, Infrastructure, Seafood, Small Business, Tourism, and Workforce Development/Research & Education).
- (d) In March 2022, MDEQ released a public "call for projects" soliciting project ideas from the public for funding consideration on this amended MIP.
- (e) On May 12, 2022, Governor Reeves convened the GCAC to begin selection of recommended projects for this amended MIP. Each sub-committee member was sent a list of projects previously selected for funding within their respective category and provided a list of remaining portal projects related to their respective committee category.
- (e) The GCAC sub-committees met, and each produced a list of recommended projects for submittal to the Governor's office. After deliberation, the Governor selected projects to fund.

Each of the projects identified in MIP Amendment #6 were developed and informed directly from a project (or projects) submitted in the Restoration Project Idea Portal.

Additionally, MDEQ completed due diligence activities on each project to evaluate constructability, feasibility, logistics, eligibility determinations, and environmental compliance reviews to confirm recommended projects could be funded by the Direct Component of the RESTORE Act.
