# MISSISSIPPI COMMISSION ON ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY OFFICIAL MINUTES AUGUST 24, 2023

The regular monthly meeting of the Commission on Environmental Quality was held on Thursday, August 24, 2023, in-person in the Commission Hearing Room at the offices of the Mississippi Department of Environmental Quality, 515 East Amite Street, Jackson, Mississippi, beginning at 9:00 a.m.

Commissioners present were: John Dane, III, Brenda Lathan, Chat Phillips, and Jack Winstead.

Commissioners Patrick Johnson, Jr., Jamie Planck Martin McRee and Billy Van Devender were not present.

Others present were: Chris Wells, Executive Director, Brent Jones, Roy Furrh, staff of MDEQ; and other staff members and visitors whose names appear elsewhere in these minutes.

The meeting was called to order by Executive Director, Chris Wells and after Mr. Winstead led the invocation, the following business was transacted:

#### Approval of Minutes

On motion made by Mr. Phillips and seconded by Ms. Lathan, the minutes of the July 27, 2023, meeting were approved and adopted as the Official Minutes. Mr. Dane abstained from voting.

<u>Water Pollution Control Revolving Loan Fund (WPCRLF) Program, Adoption of FY-2023 Intended Use Plan</u>

On behalf of staff, Mr. Brent Jones recommended the Commission adopt the FY-2023 Intended Use Plan, which was previously sent to the Commission for review. This document identifies the loan funds available to our communities for the construction of wastewater infrastructure, the communities to receive these loan funds, the loan interest rate, program deadlines, and other related information. Public comments on the draft Intended Use Plan were solicited through a public comment period and a public hearing and no comments were received, except from EPA Region 4 which resulted in some text changes and added details. In response to a question by Mr. Dane, Mr. Jones stated that there was no need to go back though a public comment period since the changes requested by EPA were minor. In response to a question by Mr. Phillips, there was some discussion about land application designations. Executive Director, Chris Wells confirmed with Mr. Jones that MDEQ staff actively conducts outreach to ensure that cities and consultants know about this funding opportunity. Following staff presentation and deliberation, on motion made by Mr. Dane and seconded by Mr. Winstead, the Commission unanimously voted to adopt the Water Pollution Control Revolving Loan Fund (WPCRLF) Program FY-2023 Intended Use Plan and that a corresponding Order be executed by the Executive Director.

Code Pt. 1, R.1.1.Y.), the Executive Director of MDEQ approved the Environmental Covenant between the Commission and Comet Street, LLC regarding the remediation of the property known as the Southland Oil Crupp Facility (Al# 79634) located at 32°46′ 59.96″ N and 90°28′ 17.56″ in Crupp, Yazoo County, MS. This portion of the Southland Oil Crupp site lies to the west of Highway 3. Environmental Site Assessments have revealed a release of petroleum impacting soils and groundwater at concentrations in excess of Target Remediation Goals (TRGs). Therefore, remediation of the site is necessary. The staff of the MDEQ has evaluated the proposed Environmental Covenant and believes that, with the conditions and restrictions contained within; the site will be in compliance with applicable State laws and standards and will be protective of the public health and the environment. #### 2. Environmental Covenant for Comet Street, LLC – 11.5 Acre Property

Pursuant to the Commission's delegation regulations (11 Miss. Admin. Code Pt. 1, R.1.1.Y.), the Executive Director of MDEQ approved the Environmental Covenant between the Commission and Comet Street, LLC regarding the remediation of the property known as the Southland Oil – Crupp Facility (AI# 79634) located at 32° 46′ 56.16" N and 90° 28′15.08" in Crupp, Yazoo County, MS. This portion of the Southland Oil – Crupp Facility is located to the east of Highway 3. Environmental Site Assessments have revealed a release of petroleum impacting soils and groundwater at concentrations in excess of Target Remediation Goals (TRGs). Therefore, remediation of the site is necessary. The staff of the MDEQ has evaluated the proposed Environmental Covenant and believes that, with the conditions and restrictions contained within; the site will be in compliance with applicable State laws and standards and will be protective of the public health and the environment.
