This seventh amendment to Mississippi's Multiyear Implementation Plan (MIP) modifies twelve projects previously accepted on the Initial MIP and subsequent amendments (Activities 1, 11, 17, 18, 21, 23, 29, 30, 36, 38, 39, and 41), which are only modified to the extent described below. Projects may start earlier or later than the proposed start dates depending on the availability of funds and readiness of the project.

Activity #1: Stennis International Airport Hangar (Modified)

This Project was accepted under Mississippi's Initial MIP. Project activities are complete, and the grant award has been closed.

Project Modification: Amendment #7 modifies the project budget to reflect the total funds expended of \$2,111,955.16. The grant is closed.

Amount and Current Status of Funding From Other Sources: This project was accepted under Mississippi's Initial MIP. Project activities are complete, and the grant award has been closed.

Activity #11: Planning Assistance – MIP Amendment and Application Development (Modified)

This project was accepted under Mississippi's Initial MIP to provide planning assistance to support the Mississippi Department of Environmental Quality (MDEQ) in the development of multiple MIP amendments. MDEQ has received a planning assistance award from the U.S. Department of the Treasury (Treasury) for this project. The proposed project modification includes an increase in funding for this project to support MDEQ in the development of future MIP amendments and applications. There is no modification to the Program Description, Need, Purpose, Objective, Location, Milestones, or Success Criteria as outlined and accepted in MIP Amendment #6.

Project Modification: This project budget is being modified to increase the Direct Component funding by \$500,000. This increase in funding is needed to support MDEQ's development of future MIP amendments and other activities under this project's scope of work.

Amount and Current Status of Funding From Other Sources: Direct Component funds will be used to provide planning assistance for the identification and evaluation of projects, programs, and activities and the development of MIP amendments, as needed. Direct Component funds will also be used for activities associated with grant application development for projects on the accepted MIP, project oversight and management activities, and the development, coordination, and execution grant awards between MDEQ and Treasury. No other funding sources are anticipated at this time.

This project qualifies as an eligible activity for Direct Component funding through 31 C.F.R. §34.201(j) - planning assistance and through 33 U.S.C. §1321(t)(1)(B)(i)(VIII) of the RESTORE Act. This activity will be implemented by the Mississippi Department of Environmental Quality and will comply with the definition of planning assistance in 31 C.F.R. §34.2.

Activity #17: Mississippi Coast Coliseum and Convention Center Site Capacity Improvements (Modified)

This project was accepted under Mississippi's MIP Amendment #1 and subsequently modified under MIP Amendment #3 and Amendment #5. MDEQ has received a grant award from Treasury for this project, and MDEQ has executed a sub-award agreement with the Mississippi Coast Coliseum and Convention Center for implementation. There is no modification to the Project Description, Need, Purpose, Objective, Location, Milestones, or Success Criteria as outlined and accepted in MIP Amendment #5.

Project Modification: The project budget is being modified to increase the Direct Component funding by \$1,815,000 to support additional site improvements consistent with the Project Description, Need, Purpose and Objective accepted in MIP Amendment #1.

Amount and Current Status of Funding From Other Sources: Additional Direct Component funds will be used in support of design, permitting, implementation of site improvements. Direct Component funds will also be used for project oversight and management activities; the development, coordination, and execution of the grant award between MDEQ and Treasury; and the development, coordination, and execution of the sub-award between MDEQ and the subrecipient. The Mississippi Coast Coliseum Commission is contributing \$280,000 in third-party funds for the project.

This activity will be implemented by the Mississippi Coast Coliseum and Convention Center and will comply with the definition of infrastructure in 31 C.F.R. §34.2.

Activity #18: Trent Lott International Airport Runway Improvements (Modified)

This Project was accepted under Mississippi's MIP Amendment #2. Project activities are complete, and the grant award has been closed.

Project Modification: Amendment #7 modifies this project budget to reflect the total funds expended of \$6,318,145.15. The grant is closed.

This Project was accepted under Mississippi's MIP Amendment #4. MDEQ has received a grant award from Treasury for this project, and MDEQ has executed a sub-award agreement with the City of Biloxi for implementation. There is no modification to the Need, Purpose, Objective, Location, Milestones, or Success Criteria as outlined and accepted in Mississippi's MIP Amendment #4.

Project Modification: The project description is being modified to include dredging of accumulated sediment in the marina area. The project budget is being modified to increase the Direct Component funding by \$5,500,000 and third-party funding by \$5,534,840.50 to support implementation of additional infrastructure improvements consistent with the Need, Purpose, Objective, Location, or Milestones as accepted in MIP Amendment #4.

Amount and Current Status of Funding From Other Sources: Direct Component funds will be used to support implementation/construction of Point Cadet Marina infrastructure upgrades, dredging and activities such as planning, engineering and design, and permitting. Direct Component funds will also be used for project oversight and management activities and the development, coordination, and execution of the grant award between MDEQ and Treasury and sub-award between MDEQ and the subrecipient. The City of Biloxi is contributing \$5,534,840.50 in third-party funds for the project.

This activity will be implemented by the City of Biloxi and will comply with the definition of infrastructure in 31 C.F.R. §34.2.

Activity #30: City of Moss Point Interstate 10 Commercial Corridor Improvements (Modified)

This Project was accepted under Mississippi's MIP Amendment #4 and subsequently modified under MIP Amendments #5 and #6. MDEQ has received a grant award from Treasury for this project, and MDEQ has executed a sub-award agreement with the City of Moss Point for implementation. There is no modification to the Need, Purpose, Objective, Location, Milestones, Success Criteria, or Project Budget as outlined and accepted in Mississippi's MIP Amendment #6.

Project Modification: The project description is being modified to include additional roadway improvements in the project area north of Interstate 10.

Amount and Current Status of Funding From Other Sources: Direct Component funds will support the implementation of the construction of roadway infrastructure improvements and associated activities such as planning, engineering, design, and permitting. Direct Component funds will also be used for project oversight and management activities; the development, coordination, and execution of the grant award between MDEQ and

Treasury; and the development, coordination, and execution of the sub-award between MDEQ and the subrecipient. No other funding sources are anticipated at this time.

This activity will be implemented by the City of Moss Point and will comply with the definition of infrastructure in 31 C.F.R.§34.2.

Activity #36: Gulfport-Biloxi Airport Site Mitigation and Improvements (Modified)

This project was accepted under Mississippi's MIP Amendment #5 and subsequently modified under MIP Amendment #6. MDEQ has received a grant award from Treasury for this project, and MDEQ has executed a subaward agreement with the Gulfport-Biloxi Regional Airport Authority for implementation. There is no modification to the Need, Purpose, Objective, Location, Milestones or Success Criteria as outlined and accepted in MIP Amendment #6.

Project Modification: The project description is being modified to include construction of an aircraft Maintenance, Repair, and Overhaul (MRO) facility, complete with an associated apron and taxi lane. Additional activities necessary to complete this proposed project modification may include, but are not limited to, construction site preparation and construction. The project budget is being modified to increase the Direct Component funding by \$6,600,000 and third-party funding by \$4,600,000.

Amount and Current Status of Funding From Other Sources: Direct Component funds will be used in support of permitting, engineering, design, site preparation, and construction for improvements at Gulfport-Biloxi International Airport. Direct Component funds will also be used for project oversight and management activities; the development, coordination, and execution of the grant award between MDEQ and Treasury; and the development, coordination, and execution of the sub-award between MDEQ and the subrecipient. Gulfport-Biloxi International Airport is contributing \$4,600,000 in third-party funds for the project.

Activity #38: Hancock County Fairground Revitalization (Modified)

This Project was accepted under Mississippi's MIP Amendment #5. MDEQ has received a grant award from Treasury for this project, and MDEQ has executed a sub-award agreement with Hancock County Board of Supervisors for implementation. There is no modification to the Project Description, Need, Purpose, Objective, Location, Milestones or Success Criteria as outlined and accepted in MIP Amendment #5.

Project Modification: The project budget is being modified to increase the Direct Component funding by \$3,536,267 and third-party funding by \$4,000,000 to support implementation of additional infrastructure improvements consistent with the Project Description, Need, Purpose, and Objective as accepted in MIP Amendment #5.

Amount and Current Status of Funding From Other Sources: Direct Component funds will be used to support construction of new site facilities and upgrades/repairs to existing facilities. Direct Component funds will also be used for project oversight and management activities; the development, coordination, and execution of the grant award between MDEQ and Treasury; and the development, coordination, and execution of the sub-award between MDEQ and any subrecipients. Hancock County is contributing \$11,000,000 in third-party funds for the project.

Project Modification: This project budget is being modified to increase the Direct Component funding by \$5,500,000 and third-party funding by \$100,000 to support implementation of additional infrastructure

improvements consistent with the Project Description, Need, Purpose, and Objective as accepted in MIP Amendment #5.

Amount and Current Status of Funding From Other Sources: Direct Component funds will be used in support of planning, design, permitting, and construction of roadway, sidewalks, signage, and subsurface drainage improvements. Direct Component funds will also be used for project oversight and management activities; the development, coordination, and execution of the grant award between MDEQ and Treasury; and the development, coordination, and execution of the sub-award between MDEQ and the sub-recipient. Jackson County is contributing \$4,100,000 in third-party funds for the project.

Project Modification: This project budget is being modified to increase the Direct Component funding by \$1,925,000 and third-party funding by \$252,856 to support implementation of additional infrastructure improvements consistent with the Project Description, Need, Purpose, and Objective as accepted in MIP Amendment #6.

Amount and Current Status of Funding From Other Sources: Direct Component funds will be used to support the planning and construction of infrastructure improvements and associated activities such as engineering and design, permitting, construction site preparation, and construction. Direct Component funds will also be used for project oversight and management activities; the development, coordination, and execution of the grant award between MDEQ and Treasury; and the development, coordination, and execution of the sub-award between MDEQ and the subrecipient. Kiln Utility and Fire District is contributing \$252,856 in third-party funds for the project.

The projects were prioritized using the following:

1. Mississippi utilized three stakeholder-driven components to identify and prioritize all projects for inclusion in MIP Amendment #7: Stakeholder Meetings; The Governor's Gulf Coast Advisory Committee (GCAC); and the Restoration Project Idea Portal. Items (a) through (e) below provide further explanation for the GCAC process:

(a) Governor Tate Reeves created the GCAC to serve as an advisory body to the Governor for recommendation of projects to be funded for Mississippi under the RESTORE Act.

(b) The GCAC is comprised of over 70 engaged stakeholders, including private citizens, non-governmental organizations, business owners, elected officials, and other community leaders from the Mississippi Coast.
(c) The GCAC formed seven sub-committees that focused on seven key areas related to the activities specified in the RESTORE Act (Eco-restoration, Economic Development, Infrastructure, Seafood, Small Business, Tourism, and Workforce Development/Research & Education).

(d) On April 3, 2023, MDEQ released a public "call for projects" soliciting project ideas from the public for funding consideration on this amended MIP.

(e) On April 25, 2023, Governor Reeves convened the GCAC to begin selection of recommended projects for this amended MIP. Each sub-committee member was sent a list of projects previously selected for funding within their


respective category and provided a list of remaining portal projects related to their respective committee category.

(e) The GCAC sub-committees met, and each produced a list of recommended projects for submittal to the Governor's office. After deliberation, the Governor selected projects to fund.

Each of the projects identified in MIP Amendment #7 were developed and informed directly from a project (or projects) submitted in the Restoration Project Idea Portal.

Additionally, MDEQ completed due diligence activities on each project to evaluate constructability, feasibility, logistics, eligibility determinations, and environmental compliance reviews to confirm recommended projects could be funded by the Direct Component of the RESTORE Act.

2. All projects included in MIP Amendment #7 are eligible for RESTORE Act funding under the Direct Component eligible activities for: infrastructure projects benefitting the economy or ecological resources; and planning assistance.
