3. Commission Approval of Brownfield Agreement Modification

The staff recommends that the Commission approve the Brownfield Agreement Modification between the Commission and McIngvale Square, LLC regarding the remediation of the brownfield property located at 820 McIngvale Road, Hernando, Desoto County, Mississippi. The administrative record for this environmental response project is referred to as the McIngvale Square site. The proposed site currently operates as a golf course maintenance facility. Soilvapor sampling indicated the presence of volatile organic compounds (VOCs) in soils. Contaminants 1,2-dichloroethane and 1,4-dioxane were detected at concentrations greater than the Environmental Protection Agency Vapor Intrusion Screening Levels, which is a potential risk for vapor intrusion. Therefore, remediation of the Brownfield Agreement Site is necessary. McIngvale Square, LLC, proposes to excavate and dispose of contaminated soil at the site prior to the construction of a new 8,000 square foot structure on the property. Previously, McIngvale Square, LLC, proposed installing a vapor barrier during the construction of the new structure. This was approved by the Commission via a Brownfield Agreement at its meeting on October 24, 2024; however, due to construction timelines, remedial, and economic considerations, McIngvale, LLC, is requesting to modify the method of remediation in the Corrective Action Plan to excavation. The proposed future land use of the site will be mixed-use, single-story structures, and parking. The staff of the MDEQ has evaluated the Brownfield Agreement Modification and believes that, with the conditions and restrictions contained within the Brownfield Agreement, the Site will be in compliance with applicable State and Federal laws and standards and will be protective of the public health and the environment. Therefore, the staff recommends that the Commission approve the Brownfield Agreement Modification between the Commission and McIngvale Square, LLC.

Executive Director, Chris Wells, will brief the Commission on the public hearing held to gather comments on the recently published changes to the water regulations under the Mississippi Air and Water Pollution Control Law.
