

MISSISSIPPI COMMISSION ON ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY 2544
OFFICIAL MINUTES
JANUARY 23, 2025

The regular monthly meeting of the Commission on Environmental Quality was held on Thursday, January 23, 2025, in-person in the Commission Hearing Room at the offices of the Mississippi Department of Environmental Quality, 515 East Amite Street, Jackson, Mississippi, beginning at 9:00 a.m.

Commissioners present were: John Dane, III, Patrick Johnson, Jr., Brenda Lathan, Kent Parrish, Jr., Chat Phillips, Billy Van Devender and Jack Winstead.

Others present were: Chris Wells, Executive Director, Thomas Wallace, Laura James, Roy Furrh, staff of MDEQ; and other staff members and visitors whose names appear elsewhere in these minutes.

After the meeting was called to order by Chair Patrick Johnson and after Mr. Phillips led the invocation, the following business was transacted:

Approval of Minutes

On motion made by Mr. Parrish and seconded by Mr. Dane, the minutes of the October 24, 2024, meeting were approved and adopted by the Commission as the Official Minutes.

Commission Approval of Brownfield Agreement Termination

Mr. Thomas Wallace stated that the Commission approved Brownfield Agreement 5969-11 in May 2011, between the Commission and Delta Biofuels, Inc for the remediation of the former Amoco Property located in Natchez, Mississippi, AI# 36761 (also known as the Amoco/Afton Chemical Site). The original brownfield agreement required the remediation of various volatile organic and petroleum compounds in the soil and groundwater. The completed remedial activities met the requirements of the MDEQ-approved Corrective Action Plan dated May 19, 2011. Delta Biofuels, Inc. requested the Commission make a determination that Delta Biofuels, Inc. completed the Brownfield Agreement. On behalf of staff, Mr. Wallace recommended the Commission determine that Delta Biofuels, Inc. completed the Brownfield Agreement and stated that staff of the MDEQ evaluated the Brownfield Agreement completion request and believes that the Site is in compliance with applicable State and Federal laws and standards and will be protective of the public health and the environment. Mr. Van Devender asked if the site was still in operation. Mr. Wallace stated that while there was a new owner of the former Amoco property, he was not aware that the site was still in use. Following staff presentation and deliberation, on motion made by Mr. Dane and seconded by Ms. Lathan, the Commission unanimously voted and determined that Delta Biofuels, Inc. completed the Brownfield Agreement between the Commission and Delta Biofuels, Inc. for the remediation of the former Amoco Property located in Natchez, Mississippi.

Commission Approval of Environmental Response Action Contractor (ERAC)

Mr. Thomas Wallace stated that staff reviewed an application from a consulting firm requesting to be listed as an Environmental Response Action Contractor (ERAC) and determined it to be complete and acceptable. Therefore, on behalf of staff, Mr. Wallace recommended that the Commission approve the following firm as an ERAC:

Following staff presentation and deliberation, on motion made by Mr. Winstead and seconded by Mr. Phillips, the Commission unanimously voted to approve S&ME, Inc., from Huntsville, AL as an ERAC.

Commission Approval of Underground Storage Tank Fee for Fiscal Year 2026

Mr. Thomas Wallace stated the Underground Storage Tank (UST) Advisory Council and staff of the MDEQ met on November 14, 2024, to discuss the current status of the UST program and for the UST Advisory Council to provide a recommended tank fee to the Commission for the Fiscal Year 2026. Fiscal Year 2024 expenditures and accomplishments and the expected expenditures for Fiscal Year 2026 were provided in the UST report which was previously sent to the Commission for review on the UST program. On behalf of MDEQ staff, Mr. Wallace recommended that the Commission approve the UST Advisory Council’s recommended \$150 tank fee for fiscal year 2026. Following staff presentation and deliberation, on motion made by Mr. Dane and seconded by Ms. Lathan, the Commission unanimously voted to approve the UST Advisory Council’s recommended \$150 tank fee for fiscal year 2026.

Title V Program Fee Recommendation for FY 2026 - Request to Conduct the Public Notice Period

Ms. Laura James stated that a copy of the report containing the Title V Advisory Council's Title V Program Fee recommendation for FY 2026 was previously forwarded to the Commission for review. It is both the Title V Advisory Council’s recommendation and the staff’s recommendation to set the emissions component of the fee schedule to \$27 per ton of regulated air pollutants with a tiered minimum fee structure, which is a reduction from the previously established rate of \$32 per ton and keep the complexity component the same as last year’s tiered maintenance fee structure. On behalf of MDEQ staff, Ms. James requested approval to hold a public hearing to receive comments regarding the proposed fee and to proceed with public notice of the hearing. After the public hearing has been held, the public comment period has ended, and comments have been reviewed, staff will bring the fee recommendation back before the Commission for final action. Following staff presentation and deliberation, on motion made by Mr. Phillips and seconded by Mr. Winstead, the Commission unanimously voted to proceed with a public comment period and a public hearing to receive comments regarding the proposed FY 2026 Title V Program Fee and to proceed with public notice of the hearing.

Briefing to the Commission on Waters of the State

Executive Director, Chris Wells, provided a briefing to the Commission on the recently published proposed changes to the water regulations under the Mississippi Air and Water Pollution Control Law. There was some discussion between Mr. Wells and the Commission about these regulations. Mr. Wells stated there is a current comment period open to the public through April 17, 2025. This briefing was for informational purposes only and did not require any action by the Commission.

Asbestos Certifications

On previous authority delegated to the Head, Office of Pollution Control, the staff reported that 293 asbestos certifications had been issued since the last report.

Lead Paint Certifications

On previous authority delegated to the Head, Office of Pollution Control, the staff reported that 164 lead paint certifications had been issued since the last report.

Underground Storage Tank (UST) Certifications

On previous authority delegated to the Head, Office of Pollution Control, the staff reported that 6 new and 23 renewed certifications to those who install, alter, or remove underground storage tanks had been issued since the last report.

Wastewater Operator Certifications

On previous authority delegated to the Head, Office of Pollution Control, the staff reported that 10 new and 53 renewed wastewater operator certificates had been issued since the last report.

Emergency Clean-Up Expenses

Administrative Orders

Executive Director, Chris Wells, informed the Commission that MDEQ’s budget hearing with the Mississippi House of Representatives will be held this afternoon. The budget hearing with the Mississippi Senate will be held on Monday afternoon.

Approval to Enter into Executive Session

After a brief discussion led by Executive Director Chris Wells, Mr. Winstead moved to close the meeting to discuss whether to go into executive session to discuss pending and potential litigation. Mr. Dane seconded the motion. The Commission voted unanimously to close the meeting. Mr. Wells requested the public clear the Commission hearing room other than the Commission members, and MDEQ attorneys. The Commission, on motion by Mr. Phillips and second by Mr. Dane, voted unanimously to go into executive session to discuss the matter and General Counsel Roy Furrh announced the Commission's decision to the public that had left the Commission hearing room and gathered outside in the lobby. After discussion, Mr. Phillips moved to end executive session and return to open session and Mr. Dane seconded the motion. The Commission unanimously voted in favor of the motion. Mr. Furrh invited the public to return to the Commission hearing room as the Commission returned to open session. Mr. Wells announced the Commission took no action during executive session.

Setting of Meeting

The Commission decided to meet next on Thursday, February 27, 2025, beginning at 9:00 a.m.

Adjournment

There being no further business to come before the Commission, the meeting was adjourned.
