

MISSISSIPPI COMMISSION ON ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY2607
OFFICIAL MINUTES
DECEMBER 11, 2025

The regular monthly meeting of the Commission on Environmental Quality was held on Thursday, December 11, 2025, in-person in the Commission Hearing Room at the offices of the Mississippi Department of Environmental Quality, 515 East Amite Street, Jackson, Mississippi, beginning at 9:00 a.m.

Commissioners present were: Jack Norris, Kent Parrish, Jr., Chat Phillips, Jack Winstead and Billy VanDevender.

Commissioner Patrick Johnson, Jr., was not present.

Others present were: Chris Wells, Executive Director, Thomas Wallace, Laura James, staff of MDEQ; and other staff members and visitors whose names appear elsewhere in these minutes.

The meeting was called to order by Chair Chat Phillips and after he led the invocation, the following business was transacted:

Notice of Meeting

The Commission was informed that the legal Notice of Meeting concerning the time, date, and place of this meeting had been posted publicly as required by law. The Notice of Meeting read as follows: "Please take note that the regularly scheduled meeting of the Mississippi Commission on Environmental Quality for December, 2025, will take place on Thursday, December 11, 2025, at 9:00 a.m. This meeting will be held in the Commission Hearing Room at the offices of the Mississippi Department of Environmental Quality at 515 East Amite Street, Jackson, Mississippi. As always, the public is invited to attend." This notice was posted on MDEQ's website and in the MDEQ offices in Jackson, MS on November 13, 2025.

Approval of Minutes

On motion made by Mr. Winstead and seconded by Mr. Parrish, the minutes of the September 25, 2025, meeting were approved and adopted by the Commission as the Official Minutes.

Commission Approval of Brownfield Agreement Completion

Mr. Thomas Wallace stated that the Commission approved Brownfield Agreement Order No. 7533-25 on July 24, 2025, between the Commission and JeffL, Inc., for the remediation of the former Agricultural Equipment Sales and Service site ("Site") located in Cleveland, Bolivar County, Mississippi. The original brownfield agreement required the remediation of Asbestos Containing Materials ("ACM") in excess of the Environmental Protection Agency's 1% ACM threshold. Remediation consisted of abatement and disposal of the ACM in accordance with MDEQ-approved methods and executing an Environmental Covenant to restrict groundwater and soils at the Site. The completed remedial activities have met the requirements of the MDEQ-approved Revision 1 – Proposal for Brownfield Cleanup Plan dated May 27, 2025. JeffL, Inc., has requested the Commission make a determination as to the completion of the Brownfield Agreement. On behalf of staff, Mr. Wallace recommended that the Commission determine that JeffL Inc., completed Brownfield Agreement Order No. 7533-25 and stated that staff at MDEQ evaluated the Brownfield agreement completion and believes that the Site is in compliance with applicable State and Federal laws and standards and will be protective of public health and the environment. Following staff presentation and deliberation, on motion made by Mr. Norris and seconded by Mr. VanDevender, the Commission unanimously voted and determined that JeffL, Inc. completed the Brownfield Agreement between the Commission and JeffL, Inc. for the remediation of the former Agricultural Equipment Sales and Service site ("Site") located in Cleveland, Bolivar County, Mississippi.

Title V Fee Recommendation for FY 2027 - Request to Conduct Public Notice Period

Ms. Laura James stated that a copy of the report containing the Title V Advisory Council's Title V Program Fee recommendation for FY 2027 was previously sent to the Commission for review. It is both the Title V Advisory Council's recommendation and staff's recommendation to set the emissions component of the fee schedule at \$27 per ton of regulated air pollutants with a tiered minimum fee structure, which is the

same as last year’s fee and to keep the complexity component the same as last year’s tiered maintenance fee structure. On behalf of MDEQ staff, Ms. James requested approval to hold a public hearing to receive comments regarding the proposed fee and to proceed with public notice of the hearing. After the public hearing has been held, the public comment period has ended, and comments have been reviewed, staff will bring the fee recommendation back before the Commission for final action. Following staff presentation and deliberation, on motion made by Mr. Winstead and seconded by Mr. Parrish, the Commission unanimously voted to proceed with a public comment period and a public hearing to receive comments regarding the proposed FY 2027 Title V Program Fee and to proceed with public notice of the hearing.

Briefing to the Commission

Executive Director Chris Wells provided the Commission with a brief history and update on the progress of the State Waters Alteration Program (SWAP) Proposed Draft Regulations, which are being developed to protect state water resources that are not regulated under the federal Clean Water Act. Mr. Wells stated that, since an April 2025 public hearing, MDEQ staff have considered feedback and comments received from the public on previously-proposed draft regulations and have been working diligently on revised draft regulations. MDEQ staff anticipates publishing the revised draft regulations by the end of calendar year 2025, or the beginning of 2026. The draft regulations are intended to provide clarity, certainty and flexibility, as well as streamlining and efficiencies in regard to the proposed permitting process. Public listening sessions are also planned for the Spring of 2026, and the anticipated proposed rule-making will include questions posed to stakeholders and the general public regarding specific topics on which further feedback, input and comment are needed. There was some brief discussion between the Commission and Mr. Wells. This briefing was for informational purposes only, requiring no action by the Commission.
